Step 1.

## Purpose:

Why do I want to engage?

Are the aims of the engagement clearly explained? *Prompts:* 

- Improving/changing access to services
- Understanding service experience
- Influencing service change
- Informing plans/strategies/policies

Step 2.

### Audience:

Who do I want to engage with? (Stakeholders)

#### Prompts:

- The general public and people who use our services
- People who care for others
- Groups with special interests
- Partner organisations
- Elected representatives
- Health and social care staff

Is there expertise and support available to prepare and deliver engagement?

## Prompts:

- Public Health Team
- Healthcare Improvement Scotland Engagement Team
- Critical friend/sense checking advice

Step 6.

## Approval:

Who has given the go ahead for this work?

Are the governance arrangements clear? *Prompts:* 

- Senior level sign-off
- Links to agreed Committee or Head of Service
- How will the findings be agreed and used

Step 7.

# Prepared:

Am I ready to engage?

Are all the requirements in place described in an engagement plan? (Engagement Plan templates are available)

Prompts:

- Timeline
- Agreed method
- Resources/funding/support
- Road testing/pilot approach
- Communication plan
- Approvals and use of the findings

Step 8.

# Accessibility:

How will I ensure everyone can participate?

Will there be any barriers that affect how people take part? *Prompts:* 

- Materials written in plain English with no jargon/abbreviations
- Large font for printed materials
- Induction loop for people with hearing impairment
- Consideration given to people without access to online info
- Accessible building/location for face to face events
- Etc.

Step 9.

### Feedback:

What will I do next?

How will I share the findings *Prompts:* 

- With the people who gave their views YOU SAID, WE DID
- Business papers and reports
- Record how the engagement results informed way forward
