Section 1: About the proposal

Title of Proposal

Reallocation of ICF funding

Intended outcome of proposal

Mainstream process for multi -disciplinary assessment and management of people with more than one chronic condition, building on work completed by Lorn Medical Centre.

Description of proposal

Funding had been allocated to Lorn Medical Centre to develop work in a multi -disciplinary way to identify and assess people with complex conditions and to provide a preventative input for people with chronic conditions. A backlog of approximately 400 patients have been screened and current situation is that new patients will be discussed as they are identified. The process has been developed and established, with learning being collated. Training will take place to ensure this work becomes mainstream across the disciplines over the coming year. A reduction of GP time and nurse management time has been identified and this equates to a saving of £37k in 2021 and removal of full funding of £74k in 2022. This work will effectively be mainstreamed.

A further £6k was ring fenced for work with Argyll Carers on supporting carers with their health needs and reducing social isolation. Argyll Carers now have developed their own carer support and have additional funding so the 6k through ICF is not required.

HSCP Strategic Priorities to which the proposal contributes

The HSCP Strategic Plan 2019/20 – 2021/22 states that it aims to:

- Build on the implementation of multi-disciplinary community care teams.
- Ensure anticipatory care planning is adopted to reduce the incidence of emergency hospital admissions.
- Embed the frailty pathway within all teams

The learning from the work carried out with investment from ICF should form a solid base on which to mainstream the anticipatory care planning across disciplines within the Oban area.
